We have completed funding three of our biennium Mission Grant projects. They are The Lutheran Church and School Project in La Point, Haiti \$14,800; Trinity/HOPE Feeding Haitian Children \$5,000; and Concordia Food and Clothing Co-op, Ft. Wayne, IN \$10,000.



One half of the funding has been requested and funded for Restoring Faith, Home and Community, Camp Biloxi, MS \$6,000; Immokalee Lutheran Mission Church, Immokalee, FL \$7,500; Children of Hope, Peru \$2,750; Feed My Sheep, Woodstock, GA \$2,750. Thank you all, and to God be the glory!

I hate open heights. I can't stand balconies, and when driving across a bridge, you'll find me hugging the rail along the inside lane.

The day I arrived back in Florida from adopting our 12 year old son, Joel, from China we immediately went to the National Youth Gathering in Orlando. Joel had

heard about a rock climbing wall from some of the youth and although he spoke no english he understood their gestures and their excitement. My heart stopped as we entered the doors and I scanned the highest peak at 25 feet! The instructors assured me that a web of ropes and harnesses would hold him tight. Before I could say “no thank you,” Joel was strapped in. Joel wears a leg brace and was on crutches and in a wheelchair and here he was wanting to climb this 25 foot rock wall and me, afraid terrified of heights as I said earlier.

I watched with admiration as Joel started the climb with confidence, he made it to 10 feet, then 15, then 20. But as he inched past the next face of the wall, he saw how far he still had to go. He looked down and I wasn't sure if he thought he couldn't finish or if he was just resting, but then the crowd of youth begin to cheer him on, with “you are my hero”, “look at him I couldn't do that”, “GO,GO”, you can do it”...

Funny how you stop thinking about your own fears when you are focused on encouraging someone else to overcome theirs. I realized that the same promises I had claimed for my son, as he was on that wall were true for me, too. I could do anything with God's strength.

Each day we have the same opportunity. Like God did with Joshua in the above verse and like He does with us, we can come alongside each other in some of life's hardest challenges and highest peaks and say, "Don't give up, you can do it. I'll be with you and help you, just like the young people did for my son during the National Youth Gathering."

When we take our eyes off our fears, our doubts, our struggles and focus on someone else's needs, we somehow forget our own, for a little while. In believing the power of God's promises for others, our confidence in His promises for us seems to grow as well.

Our Keynote Speaker, Dina Vendetti, is an energetic and exciting Lutheran school principal, teacher and former Young Woman Representative. How important is God's Word?

Not too long ago I started a class on How We Got the Bible, a Bible Study featuring Dr. Paul L. Maier. It has a video series and discussion questions to go along with it. And the first question it offers is "Where do you stand on the Bible?" Now on the surface of it, it almost sounds like a rhetorical question. Because you first thought might be, where else would I stand? It is God's Word.



Not too long ago I started a class on How We Got the Bible, a Bible Study featuring Dr. Paul L. Maier. It has a video series and discussion questions to go along with it. And the first question it offers is "Where do you stand on the Bible?" Now on the surface of it, it almost sounds like a rhetorical question. Because you first thought might be, where else would I stand? It is God's Word.

Indeed it is God's Word. And because it is, this is the basis for all that we believe. And what of the verses that comes to mind immediately for me is 2 Timothy 3:16 *"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,"*.

Everything we believe in the Church, everything we teach in the Church, quite frankly everything we do in the Church revolves around the fact that we understand the Bible to be God's holy inerrant Word. And from this we come to know that we are sinners in need of saving. We come to know that out of God's love He sent us our Savior Jesus.

Going back to that question, "Where do you stand on the Bible?", that Wednesday Morning Bible Study class spent the next 45 minutes discussing what that means. Part of the reason we spent so much time on this question is that not all believe as we do.

Others believe that God's Word is in the Bible. Those words sound like something we could agree with, but they are entirely misleading. They are misleading because that opens the Bible up to all kinds of discussion, like what parts are God's Word and what parts are not. What is a sin? What is a sin no longer? The trouble with that is where do you stop when you go down that road? Where do you stop cutting things out of the Bible saying it is not God's Word?

That is a huge issue in some churches today. It is an issue that separates us from others. For as we look forward to Easter, there maybe folks struggling with the message of the need for a Savior.

And that is where we come in. For we know that the Bible is indeed God's Word. John, in his Gospel account in chapter 20:30-31, spells it out so clearly for us, *"Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; [31] but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name."*

Share God's Word as you know it to be true, that those who hear the Word, may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ and that by believing they may have life eternal life, in His Name.
